John Leland Stuart Vaala passed away on December 29th amongst the presence of a loving family at the age of 86 years old. Born with a twinkle in his eye and a humorous quip at the ready, he charmed people young and old.

He will be proudly remembered for his career in science. He spent 27+ years at Medtronic leading the development of the pacemaker. He also was an employee at Honeywell and Plastics, Inc. where he was a part of the team who developed the joystick used in the Apollo missions including the handle utilized by Neil Armstrong, Buzz Aldrin and Michael Collins on the Apollo 13 moon landing.

Sources of Retiree Information

As VSP Board Members, we get many questions from retirees as to where they can obtain information on their benefits, how to get Medtronic Foundation grants and charitable giving matches, or whom to contact if they have questions. Listed below are the key sources for that information.

A. Benefits

- 1. Go to benefits.medtronic.com
- 2. Click on **Retirees** on the top line of the page
- 3. If you have not done so, please register to create a username and password. This will give you access to the site and, also, your specific information.
- 4. Once you open the site, you will have access to multiple resources on retiring, health summaries, health plans, pre-65, post-65, etc. Specifically, if you open the **Retirement Planning Guide** (on left hand side of page, under **Resources**) and go to page 23, you will find a list of key phone numbers and websites for your use.

B. Medtronic Foundation -Volunteer and Giving Site

Note: As a retiree, you will need a new login to access MDT Foundation Resources. Your employee login will no longer work after you retire. To do this, you must go to:

https://medtronic.yourcause.com/auth/basic

Once you login, you will have access to the volunteer grant and charitable matching site which is managed by YourCause for the MDT Foundation.
