Dear Retiree:

This notice is to inform all our retiree's that beginning April 1, 2018 there will be a change to how retiree access Medtronic facilities. Due to changes with Medtronic global security and facility access control policies and standards, beginning April 1, 2018, you will need to arrange for a Medtronic employee to be with you at all times while on Medtronic property to provide an escort to and from the guest entrances of the buildings. Your escort will need to remain with you the entire time while you are in any Medtronic facility.

As Medtronic retirees are typically invited to some company events (e.g., holiday program at Operational Headquarters in December) that during these larger, invite only events retirees will be allowed general area access without an escort; however starting April 1st 2018, for all other dates and circumstances, including the onsite fitness centers, cafeteria, coffee shops, visiting current Medtronic personnel, meetings, retiree events, off hour events or visiting the company store, that an escort must be arranged and to be with you at all times.
